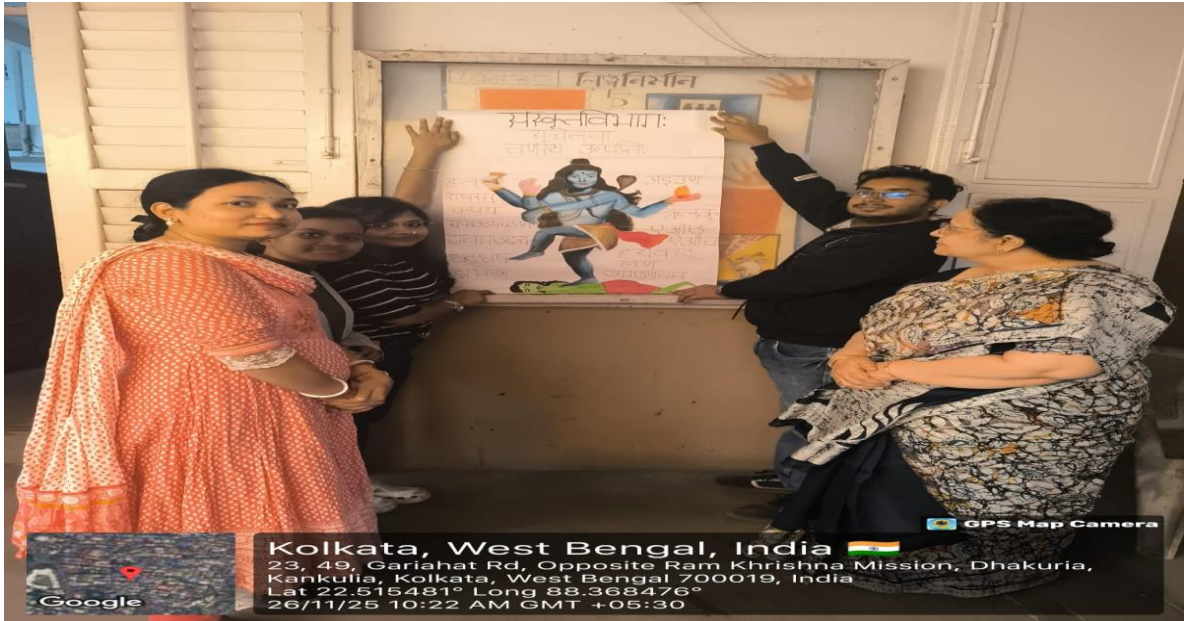


**Activities Sivanath Sastri College**

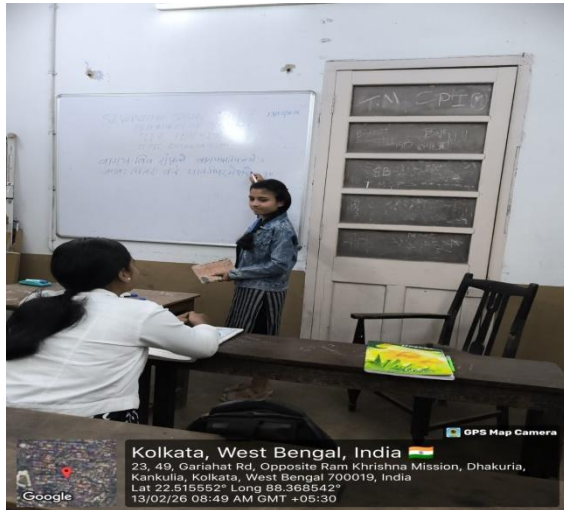

These Sutras are 14 special sound sequences used by Panini to organize Sanskrit grammar efficiently in the Ashtadhyayi. According to Hindu tradition, these sounds came from the drum of Shiva and form the basis of Sanskrit phonetics and grammatical rules.



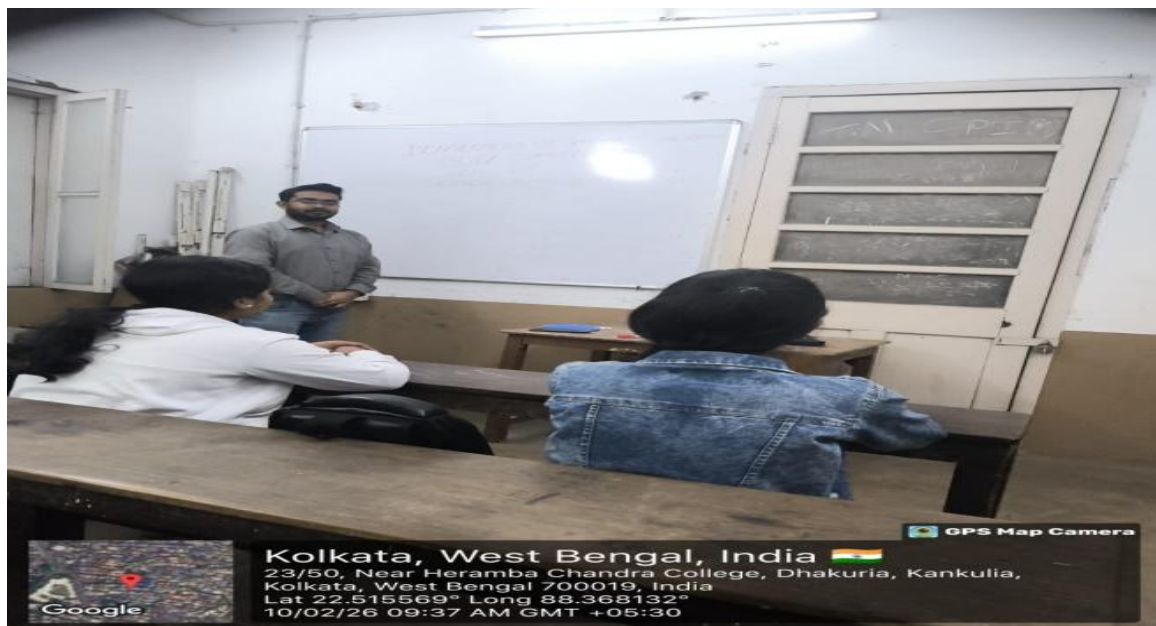

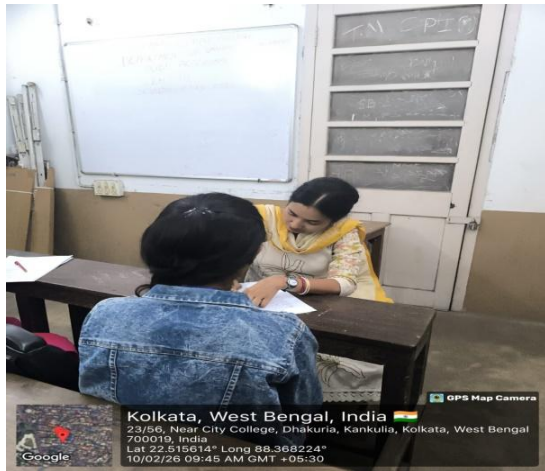
